## Foreword

This summary of Claude Thomas ("CT") Waidner's ancestors and descendants has been compiled from three primary sources:

1. Email correspondence between CT Waidner and myself,
2. Information available from the LDS Church's family history archives and presently available on the [www.familysearch.com](http://www.familysearch.com) web site, and
3. The Waidner family history information gathered and collated by my father, John T. Waidner, Sr. during his retirement.

Other sources included some sketchy information at other web sites and from an obituary for Henry P. Bergey, who married Edna R. Waidner.

The information available from [www.familysearch.com](http://www.familysearch.com) does not directly connect to CT Waidner. That connection was made via a single card found in J. T. Waidner, Sr.'s card file. That card, listing Christian F. Waidner, also listed C. F. Waidner's three children and adopted daughter. The oldest son is Claude Franklin Waidner, who is CT's father. The other two natural children were Dorothy Waidner and Raymond Thomas Waidner. Another bit of evidence linking CT Waidner with Christian F. Waidner is the note on the file card indicating that Christian moved to Sullivan County, Indiana. CT Waidner knew that his father was raised in Sullivan County, thus the connection is much more firmly established. Further evidence is CT Waidner's recollection that his father's sister was known as "Dot", a common nickname for Dorothy.

John T. Waidner, Sr. did determine that this Waidner family is not directly related to his branch of the family and surmised that CT and his ancestors descended from a Louis Waidner who emigrated from Wittemberg, Germany, and settled in Allentown, PA. Wittemberg is near Berlin. J. T. Waidner's family came from Bad Herrenalb, which is in the southern German state of Baden-Württemberg and located south of Karlsruhe in the Black Forrest. My research has confirmed my father's conjectures.

One bit of the puzzle is still missing: how did J. T. Waidner, Sr. come by the information now found on the file card? He did not indicate his sources, although the source, in the form of a letter or reference to an archive may yet be found in the voluminous files he left behind. Perhaps that bit of information will eventually surface.

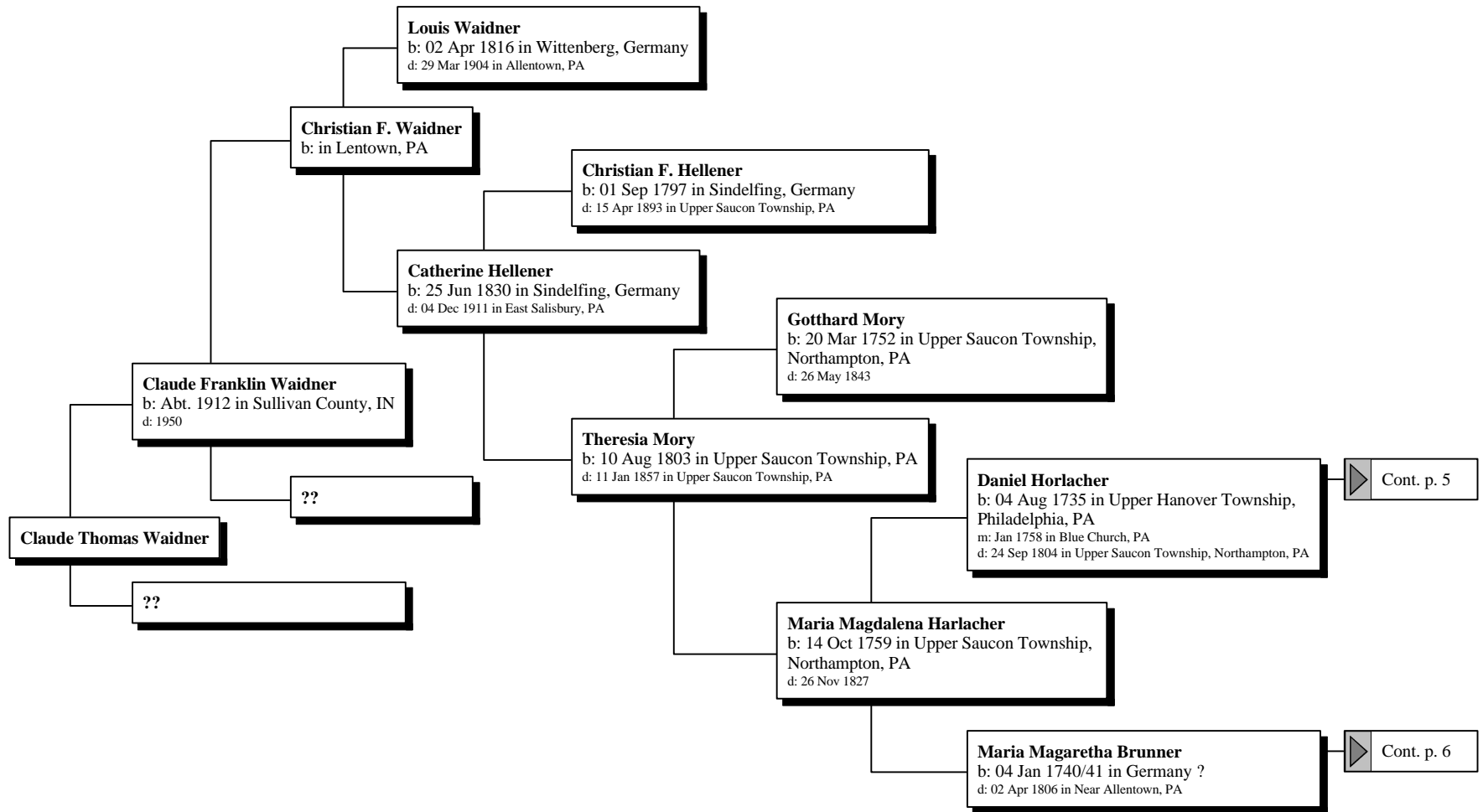

This history is not complete. Further information may come from a visit to a LDS Family History Center or a genealogical library, visits to grave sites, and inspection of Sullivan County records, etc., which I have have not done.

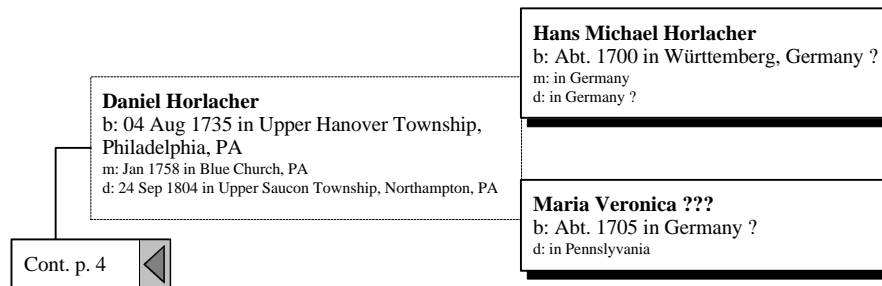

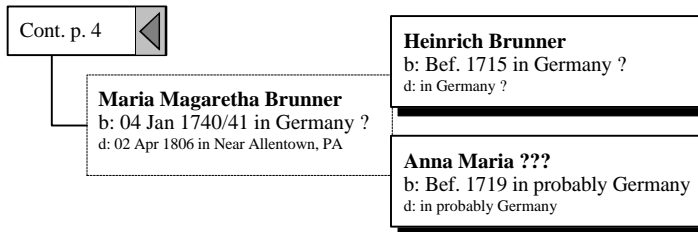
*Ancestors of Claude Thomas Waidner*

## Charles John Waidner, V. S.

As a veterinarian Dr. Waidner is widely known as having located at Hellertown immediately after his graduation from New York College of Veterinary Surgeons in 1889. He is not only widely known as a skilled professional man but as a public spirited citizen who in whatever position placed served with fidelity and zeal. He is a son of Louis and Catherine Hellener Waidner, the former having come from Witten-berg, Germany locating at Bethlehem and later at Allentown, Pennsylvania. As a young man he was a soldier in the Revolution of 1849 and was one of the many young German men, among them Carl Schurz, who came to America to escape political persecution.

Charles John Waidner was born in Allentown, Pennsylvania March 2, 1861, removed to Saucon Township and there attend public and private schools. Upon starting out in life he became an employee of Dr. H. D. Heller and for nine years continued in his service. This association begat in him an ambition to acquire a profession and finally he became a student at the New York College of Veterinary Surgeons, whence he was graduated V. S. class of 1889. He at once began practice in Hellertown and vicinity and has since very satisfactorily practiced his profession, he being the only graduate veterinarian in that borough. Dr. Waidner is a member of the Pennsylvania State Veterinary Medical Association and of the Alumni Association of New York College of Veterinary Surgeons, now the veterinary department of the New York University. He has been frequently consulted and employed by the Pennsylvania Live Stock Board and is the local representative of that Board. Dr. Waidner has made a special study of tuberculosis among cattle, and is rated an authority on that disease. He has kept pace with every advance in veterinary science, and is an honor to his profession. He was active in the various war drives, and served as chairman of the lower Saucon committee for the Salvation Army fund campaign. For twenty years he was a member of Hellertown Borough Council serving some years as president of Council, having been in that office during the period the water works system was installed in the borough. He was a member of the Board of County Commissioners for three years, for two years was county prison inspector and in these positions he served his constituency well. He is one of the influential Democrats of the county and has served long on the local committee and recently re-elected a member of the advisory board. Dr. Waidner is a member of the Reformed Church, a Past Noble Grand of the Hellertown Lodge of Independent Order of Odd Fellows, a member of the Patriotic Sons of America, Bethlehem Lodge Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, Jacksonian Democratic Association, and a past chief and charter member of Hellertown Castle No. 112 Knights of the Golden Eagle.

Dr. Waidner married march 7, 1890, Ida Schlotter, daughter of Daniel and Amada (Ruth) Schlotter of Up-per Saucon Township, Lehigh County. Dr. and Mrs. Waidner are the parents of three children: Edna Ruth residing at home, Kate Amanda a stenographer, John Louis a soldier of the United States, serving in France with Company A, Fourteenth Machine Gun Battalion: following the armistice he joined the 5th Division United States Regular Army at Camp Green, North Carolina and again returned to Europe with the Army of Occupation. The family are members of the Reformed Church.

Dr. Waidner is a great grandson of Christian F. Hellener, who, on his ninety fifth birthday recited to inter-ested listeners some of his past history and thrilling experiences by land and by sea and how he came to leave his native land to find a home in the United States. He was of prominent German family, the Von Helleners being of noble rank, and he was a remarkable man in many ways. He was gifted artist, his water color paintings, his coat of arms and genealogy being yet carefully preserved.

He was born in Sindelfinger, Wüttemberg Germany September 1st, 1797 and died in Upper Saucon township, Lehigh County, in that part of eastern Salisbury, now embraced in the borough of Fountain Hill, April 15, 1893 in his ninety sixth year. His youth was spent in those stirring years when Napoleon's might was over-turning thrones and dynasties in Europe. He recalled the burning of Moscow and when he was fifteen of age, George forth ascended the throne of England, Lord Byron dies and in the United States the second war started and the first Rail Road was established. He was a finely educated man and having decided artistic talent acquired some promi-nence as a sculptor, but finally he allowed this to drop into the back ground and he devoted himself to the more plebian but also more profitable work of a marble cutter. In 1817 he in company with number of his school friends, visited Amsterdam, intending there to take ship for United States. He had ample funds for the voyage, but a rascally agent, Jacob Baird, swindled him out of his money, but he sailed with the ship nonetheless. There were seven hundred passengers on board and from the beginning of the voyage they encountered severe storms. The ship was finally driven far out of her course, the captain died and it was fifty seven weeks before they made a safe port, quarantined at a Portuguese port for one hundred days and while there, Christian Hellener acquired the Portuguese language. In 1819 he made another attempt to cross the Atlantic and reached New York. Soon afterward he crossed by coach to Philadelphia where he learned the bakers trade. He worked several years there then went to into Bucks County, having heard that Jacob Baird, his Amsterdam swindler agent was living there. He found the man but this was not the Jacob Baird he wanted. The country pleased Mr. Hellener and journeying up the Saucon he came to Upper Saucon Township and there settled. He married his employers daughter, Theresa Morey, the ceremony being performed by Rev. Zeller, the Reformed Pastor of Allentown. In Upper Saucon, Christian F. Hellener wove carpets and bed spreads and later took up stone cutting which he followed until 1852. He then moved to what is now Fountain Hill borough in East Salisbury and bought a farm of thirty two acres which he cultivated in connection with his stone cutting until weight of years caused him to retire. Theresa Morey Hellener died in 1857 aged fifty two years, both she and her husband being buried in Friedensville Lutheran Church Cemetery. They were the parents of three children: Anna Maria Magdalena died unmarried: Cath-erine married Louis Waidner and J. Elias married Mary Snyder and lived in Fountain Hill. Louis and Catherine Hellener Waidner were the parents of three children: Dr. Charles John whose career has been traced in this review; Christian F. who moved to Sullivan County, Indiana and Mary who never married.

"EAST HILLS' WAIDNER GIVES HIS STUDENTS LOTS OF RESPONSIBILITY

He's been a school teacher, steel worker, history expert, naturalist, scout leader, world traveler, map enthusiast, photo buff, bike rider, backpacker, horseback rider, fisherman, camper, white-water raftsman and, last but not least, a life saver. Literally. The life of John "Jack" Waidner reads like something gleaned from a profile section in National Geographic. Or maybe an autobiography of a modern-day sightseer intent on finding the end of the rainbow.

He has left his footprints on nearly every place worth seeing between Europe and Oregon. And if you want to talk about such things as tombstones in Wind Gap, cavalry forts in Nebraska or the diet of dinosaurs in Utah, Jack Waidner might be the man for the job.

He speaks of his hobbies and his jaunts with great fervor, and just when you think a conversation might end, the North Bethlehem resident bubbles anew - "Here, look at this!" - and unrolls a United States map marked by red and black lines showing the routes of his travels, by road or by rail.

The swirl of color makes the map look as if some kid went crazy with crayons, so extensive have been Jack Waidner's trips. The Rocky Mountains look like one of his favorite areas, as does the Northwest, the Southeast, the Midwest, New England, California. But when pressed to name the one place best suited for an outdoorsman like himself, the one place he prefers to all others when it comes time to hammer a tent peg or pump up a raft, Waidner shows no hesitation. "Pennsylvania".

He loves the state's deep forests and rolling hills, its winding rivers and its rich colonial past. The proof is in many of the 15,000 color slides he has taken. So it's little wonder that Bethlehem Area School District officials looked in the direction of Waidner, a teacher at East Hills Middle School, when they launched a package of programs whose focus was directed outside the classroom.

"It was back in the mid-'70s, when the district was pushing 'lifetime sports - hiking, fishing, skiing, bicycling, things that aren't competitive.

The district had a natural selection when it tapped Waidner to head the hiking and bicycling programs, the latter since disbanded. "I've been a camper all my life," says Waidner. "I was taking hikes forever."

It was his desire to be outdoors as much as possible that in part prompted Waidner to give up a lucrative position as an inspector of beam yards at the Bethlehem Steel Corp. and enter the teaching profession in 1963. After all, he would be free on weekends and during summers. And he always had enjoyed working with Boy Scouts. He had been a scoutmaster and a member of an advisory committee.

Using a hiking stick handed down by his great-grandfather, Waidner still is lured to the wilderness despite a heart condition that necessitated a by-pass operation last April. On one weekend each month of the school year, a handful of students from East Hills and Freedom High scramble onto two school district vans and are taken to the Lehigh River Gorge State Park, between Jim Thorpe and White Haven, or the Appalachian Trail or any of the other sites favored by hikers and campers.



The students come away from the outings familiar with flower and fauna, local railroad lore and historical ruins, Waidner says. There are some rules for hikers, including a ban on transistor radios.

"I want to hear the streams running and the wind blowing through the trees," Waidner says, laughing.

On some occasions students return to the site, with parents in tow. But despite the attractiveness, a hike can take a dangerous turn. Waidner found that out in November 1978 when he hiked Broad Mountain near Jim Thorpe.

Waidner was in a group that was hiking near Glen Onoko Falls when a rock fell toward one of the hikers, an 8-year-old boy. Waidner pushed the youth aside and deflected the rock with his hands. Results: One safe little boy and 20 stitches in Waidner's right hand.

"You sort of sense this stuff when it comes and you act quickly," he said at the time.

The hiking and bicycling programs were added to Waidner's own list of projects that sidestep the classroom - among them, a student crafts program held each year in Bethlehem's historic quarter, and, several years ago, an archaeological dig near Glendon.

The Junior Craftsman program was started in the early 1970s, inspired by a class trip to a gunpowder mill in Wilmington, Del., where Waidner and the students saw presentations of 19th century living.

"They were using adults who showed the junior high students the way of working in the early gunpowder mills," Waidner says. "I thought, why can't we use the setting under the Hill-To-Hill Bridge and do something similar, using older students to show colonial crafts to younger students."

Under the program Waidner set up with the help of district administrators, 8th graders who are enrolled in the school's gifted student program simulate such tasks as carpentry, pottery, weaving, blacksmithing, gunsmithing and fur trapping. The beneficiaries of these demonstrations are district 4th graders who are taught local history in the classroom. The public is invited to the demonstrations. Waidner says the key to such a program, held on two consecutive weekends each May, is that it teaches a student the "Three I's." They are innovation, involvement and improvisation.

"This is the culmination of the final major project that the gifted student does before going to high school. It gives them a sense of responsibility. We recommend what books to read, show film strips and slides taken of other programs over the years. But the students do the research."

Waidner has developed other unusual programs at East Hills where he taught history and geography before being chosen to head up the school's gifted student program. One such program outside the classroom was an archaeological dig at an old iron foundry in Glendon where students unearthed an old bottle and some rusty bits of iron.

And, as part of a social studies project on the Lehigh-Delaware Canal system, students went on a field trip to the canal and, when they returned to the classroom, they used balsa wood to construct small replicas of the canal lock, a canal boat and a covered bridge.

Waidner also has had students research the Civil War diaries of Thomas Rogers Booth, a Bethlehem resident and an ancestor of Waidner who had served as a captain in the Union Army.

"Turns out he also was a whist player," says Waidner.

There have been other projects - a walk across the Brooklyn Bridge to commemorate the span's

100th anniversary; bike hikes to the northern part of the county where students snapped photos of farmland and stream systems, and a trip to a cemetery in Wind Gap where students used crayon and tissue paper to duplicate the names and dates on tombstones for research purposes back at school.

"These are things students never would be able to do in the classroom," Waidner says. "We need teachers who are willing to open up new avenues for additional learning. We definitely have the teachers to do these things, but it takes experience. To go out into the field takes lots of planning."

Waidner's programs have attracted the attention of the Pennsylvania Department of Education. In 1973, he was one of 10 finalists for Pennsylvania's Teacher of the Year Award and a candidate for the National Teacher of the Year Award.

The education department also had a photography crew join Waidner's students on a bike hike for a television program that focused on "extending the classroom out of doors," which Waidner says was aired on public television.

There are no new educational programs being planned by the East Hills teacher at the moment. But that doesn't mean Waidner is not thinking about it. Possibly, he says, he'll have students use topographic maps to simulate famous military battles. And maybe he'll send students to small "crossroad" towns in the area and have them interview the residents and take pictures of the buildings.

Where does Waidner get his ideas for his programs?

From his experiences as a youth, he says.

"I just try to think about what used to appeal to me," he says. "I just dream them up left and right."

## Revision record

### **25 July 1999**

Revisions were made to the Schlotter family line to highlight the possibility that Susanna Fretz was married to Abraham Schlotter and then to Daniel Schlotter. These two men may have been brothers. The Abraham and Susanna marriage is noted as "about 1814". The only child of Susanna that has been identified is Daniel F. Schlotter, b. 1822, which suggests that Abraham died and Susanna remarried to Daniel. The descendent chart and report for Daniel Schlotter were deleted and similar items for Susanna Fretz substituted.

Source material citations were added and the descendent report format changed to move all source material citations to end notes.

A kinship report and a summary of individuals with their birth and death information was added at Fred Kull's suggestion.
